The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, Because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to captives and freedom to prisoners (Isa 61:1).

The female inmates of Nashville's Metro-Davidson County detainment facility witnessed this passage above from the Word of God in action through Operation Impact Lives (OIL). From prayer, to music, to sound biblical teaching, to the presentation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ; these women afflicted by sin and bondage were touched in a powerful way. Their hearts were mended by messages of God's forgiveness; they recognized their spiritual liberty attained only by grace through faith in Jesus Christ; and they realized they could be free from the power and influence of sin in their lives by focusing on the Word of Truth and the influence of the Holy Spirit. Not only were they given messages of faith, hope, and love to affect them in their present situation, but the team also provided them with the spiritual tools to continue their walk with Jesus Christ and press forward in faith towards their calling to be ministers of grace to others.

The grace of God was emphasized, so that they would recognize all that the Lord has already done for them because of His loving kindness toward the human race. The required faith necessary to receive the grace of God was explained, so that the ladies would understand that the only Christian way of life is through the complete and total trust in the sacrifice of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The hope that keeps Christians moving forward in faith was exemplified by the O.I.L. team members and the stories of saints from the Scriptures, so that the ladies could see for themselves that they could have this living hope as well.

Lastly, we strongly encouraged the ladies to continue a daily walk with the Lord as we pointed to Scriptures promising them that God can and will transform them from the inside out through the intake of the Word of God, the influence of God the Holy Spirit, daily prayer and confession of sins, and fellowship with other believers.

History of BTCP

In 1988 Dennis Mock taught a conference for pastors in Mombasa, Kenya. He quickly realized that these men were eager to learn, but had never had any opportunity for theological or ministry training. Following his experience in Mombasa, Dennis wrote a comprehensive 10-course curriculum designed to equip pastors with essential Bible knowledge and basic pastoral skills. This curriculum was first taught in Nairobi, Kenya in 1990. Since that time the Lord has expanded the ministry of BTCP around the world through hundreds of ministry partners using the program in over 80 countries.

It has been the vision of Grace Prison Ministries to start a scholarship program to extend nonformal theological training to the world untrained pastors, deacons, missionaries, evangelists, and church leaders. Our target group are but not limited to those released from prison and jail. Under the leadership of Keithian L. Starling President and Founder of Grace Prison Ministries. G.P.M is planning to start a Bible Institute here in Nashville Tennessee beginning in the summer.

The Bible Institute will use the Bible Training Center for Pastors (BTCP) concepts and curriculum, to provide trans-denominational basic Bible training for international pastors and church leaders that will adequately and effectively equip them with the necessary knowledge and practical skills for the work of local church ministry and missionary work here and abroad.

Please pray for this ministry and If your are motivated to contribute to this effort it will be greatly appreciated. Each manual per course will cost us \$20.00. There are 10 courses in this curriculum. Presently we have three students ready to start in the summer.

Grace Prison Ministries At-A-Glance

Grace Prison Ministries Inc. is a Christian, grace-oriented, nonprofit organization incorporated in Tennessee which focuses on changing the lives of prisoners and their families through evangelism and sound bible teaching.

GPM travels to jails, prisons, and youth detention centers throughout the United States; evangelizing individuals with the message of Jesus Christ at four to five institutions per month. This activity is important because the message of Jesus Christ brings hope, forgiveness, and change to those incarcerated. Therefore, they can be law-abiding citizens and good role model s in our society. Upon our visits we provide bibles for those in need of bibles. In conjunction with the above activities G.P.M. has the following ministries which are design to bring glory to Jesus Christ and edification to believers:

Discipleship through Mail

The Discipleship through Mail outreach is designed to equip new believers in the basic fundamental doctrines for living the normal Christian life. Bible lessons and resources are mailed to individual students in various prisons, jails, and youth detention centers, providing them an opportunity to learn and grow at their own pace. These lessons are reviewed by us and mailed back to the students with comments that will help them better understand Bible truths. There are nearly 200 students enlisted in this program nationwide. D.T.M. is also designed to help develop the serious students who have already completed the basics, by creating personalized studies and providing more biblical resources to help them continue their growth to maturity. Upon completion of the basics, students are rewarded with a study bible, which is hard for some to get in prison.

Grace Refuge Transition Facility

In an effort to assist recently released inmates, GPM offers temporary housing, food, clothing, and limited transportation. By God's grace, GPM has recently purchase a 2400 square ft. house on 1 acre of land with a barn in Madison, TN. This facility will be temporal housing for those recently released inmates that have been proved and positive towards learning and applying the word of God to life. We hope to turn the barn into a chapel some day, so that the ex-inmates can get nourished in the truth for continued discipleship.
