Knowing God in difficult times

God is in control of every event in history and allows disaster for a reason. He allows disaster to awaken carnal believers to their need to amend their ways through confession of known sins in their lives, and to learn and apply His Word (Jonah 1: 1-3:4 Luke 15:11-27, Hebrews 12: 4-11). He also allows testing to increase the faith and godly character of believers positive to His Word. Trials in the growing believers are an opportunity to apply knowledge to experience.

"...do not be worried about your life, as to what you will eat or what you will drink; nor your body, as to what you will put on...Look at the birds of the air, that they do not sow, nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you [the believer in Jesus Christ] not worth much more than they...? Why are you worried...? You of little faith...For your heavenly Father knows that you need these things. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." (Matthew 6:25a, 26, 28a, 30b, 32b, 33)

The Word of God reveals that God is:

Sovereignty- He is the supreme ruler of the universe. He is in control. (Psalm 47:2)

Righteousness- God is perfect and sinless in His character. He can't fellowship with sin. (Deuteronomy. 32:4) **Justice**- God is always fair and shows no partiality. He judges with fairness and blesses with fairness; He never makes exceptions for anyone. (Deuteronomy. 32:4, Romans. 5:12, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Matthew 6:25-26, Hebrews 12:5-11) **Love**- God is love and His love is unchangeable. (1 John 4:8b, 16, John 3:16, Romans. 5:8,)

Eternal life- God the self-existing One, has no beginning or end. (Psalms 90:2, 102: 29, John 3:36)

Omnipotence- God is all power and has unlimited ability. (Luke 1:37)

Omniscience- God is all knowing. (Job 37:14-16, John 18:4) **Omnipresence**- God is everywhere without any limitations. (Psalm 139: 7-12)

Immutability- God is unchangeable. He is reliable. (Lamentations 3: 22-23, Hebrews. 6:17-19, 1 King 8:56) **Veracity**- God can not lie. He means what He says. (Numbers 23:19, Titus 1:2)

How do we apply this knowledge of who God is to our lives? Let's take omnipotence for example and see how it applies to our lives. In Mark chapter 4 our Lord Jesus Christ manifested His omnipotence in calming the storm.

"On that day, when evening came, He said to them [His disciples], 'Let us go on the other side.' Leaving the crowd, they took Him along with them in the boat, just as He was; and other boats were with Him. And there arose a fierce gale of wind, and the waves were breaking over the boat so much that the boat was already filling up. Jesus Himself was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him and said to Him, "Teacher", do You not care that we are perishing?" And He got up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Hush, be still." And the wind died down and it became perfectly calm. And He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?"(Mark 4:35-40)

Our Lord Jesus Christ truly cared for those in the boat just as He cares for us today. Peter says:

"...casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you." (1 Peter 5:7)

He allows things to happen sometime to prove our faith and cause us to depend on Him. We are challenged in trials to concentrate on who God is and His plan for our lives. It is sad that many do not know God or His plan for their lives

Letter written about Keithan's visit

On December 30, Keithian Starling, a former student of Bill E. Ireland Youth Detention Center, came back to speak with our youth. His message was a very passionate one as he shared how he had learned the hard way and wished that he had listened to those trying to provide guidance. His presentation was a powerful message to the youth about their sin-nature and how it can lead them to go negative or positive. He told the group his life story; how he came from a single parent home and tried to be a provider for his family at the age of 14, but he went about it the wrong way. He started selling drugs and everything to accommodate his life style. He spent the majority of his youth incarcerated; he thought he couldn't change until the Judge gave him 40 years. It was at that time that he decided to make a change and turn his life over to God and repent for his sins. He was blessed to do only two and a half years of his time. He started Grace Prison Ministries in Nashville Tennessee and travels to different prison and youth detention centers ministering to young adults to get them to change.

Mr. Starling's message was one of encouragement to our students to go straight and listen to what is being instilled in them. It was great having this young man to come and speak to our youth because he, like many of our youth, once believed that he would never amount to anything in life and his story goes to show that people can change.

Grace Prison Ministries: Overview

Grace Prison Ministries is incorporated in the State of Tennessee as a Christian, non-profit organization. We are a non-denominational ministry focusing on changing the lives of prisoners through evangelism and sound Bible teaching. We endeavor to restore individuals one by one, thereby making a positive contribution to our neighborhoods and our society.

Our Mission:

In obedience to the command of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ:

"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations...teaching them to observe all that I commanded you... (Matthew 28:19a, 20a)

We have the following objectives:

1. Evangelize the unbeliever with the simple grace gospel: salvation by "faith alone in Christ alone." With this in mind, our primary job is to make the gospel as clear as possible, without gimmicks and without imposing our personal views on anyone. Rather, we leave the gospel matter between God the Holy Spirit and the person. Our duty is to present the gospel and leave the decision "to believe" or "to reject" solely to the individual.

2. Assist those who have responded positively to the Gospel in the following manner:

- a) Encourage and help them form study groups.
- b) Teach them sound Bible doctrine, provide Bibles and doctrinal materials such as Bible teaching on CD, and written literature which will enable them to fulfill the command to "grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18a); thus enabling them to re-enter society as productive citizens and good role models.

c) Assist those who possess the spiritual gift of pastor-teacher to obtain study Bibles and resources to help them prepare so they may

minister effectively to others both during their stay in prison and upon release.

- d) Direct believers upon release to a doctrinally sound local Church or study group.
- e) Direct the poor but positive believer, with a teaching gift, to acquire seminary training.

3. To assist inmates, upon release from custody, who are homeless and jobless.

- a) Network with employers to assist with jobs so they can become self-sustaining.
- b) Direct those released from incarceration to grace-oriented transition housing where Bible doctrine is the cornerstone of a structured environment.

4. To assist the needy as God provides and directs us. These may include but are not limited to:

- a) Provision of food.
- b) Provision of clothing.
- c) Assistance to those who are associated with Grace Prison Ministries when needed.

5. Occasionally hold crusades in prisons that we have visited inviting guest evangelists and pastors. Giving those who have the call, to serve the Lord in prisons, an opportunity to serve.

6. To write periodic reports to update our associates regarding our ministry.

Biography

Keithian L. Starling is a native of Albany, Georgia and grew up in a singleparent home in a poor neighborhood of drugs, gangs, and violence. Keithian was so far behind in his work to pass the eighth grade. Due to constant incarceration, he droped out of school. He turned to a life of drug dealing, partying, and crime. He spent most of his young adult life incarcerated.

In 2000, while incarcerated in Albany, Georgia, he prayed and asked God to reveal His ways to him and a few days later he had the privilege of receiving books by R.B. Theime Jr. from Ernest Smith of Lost & Found Ministries. Mr. Smith is a member of Albany Bible Church. These books opened Keithian's eyes to salvation—by grace, through faith—and how to live the unique spiritual life through the power of the Spirit and the word of God. When he understood the doctrine of "Faith alone in Christ alone, confession of sins & keep moving, faith-rest, the filling of the Holy Spirit, and other doctrines taught by R.B. Theime Jr., he became a lover of truth and became burdened for those suffering for lack of truth. Keithian started teaching the doctrine he was learning to the inmates and guards. When he was released from prison in 2003, he continued his pursuit of doctrine at Albany Bible Church where Pete Daughtry is the Pastor-teacher.

"I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who strengthened me, because he considered me faithful, putting me into service...It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost of all". (1 Timothy 1:12, 15)

From 2003-2006, while attending Albany Bible Church, God opened doors for Keithian to visit schools, prisons, jails and youth detention centers presenting the gospel and basic procedures to living the Christian life.

In 2004, Keithian went to a community college and got his G.E.D and started pursuing a diploma so he could become a radiology technician. After the first two courses he dropped out and enrolled in seminary through extension at Tyndale Theological Seminary in order to be a better trained minister of the Word.

From July 2004 to August 2006, Keithian worked for Nanze Spings Water Company as a salesman. While working at this company his daily route brought him in contact with many who needed the gospel. This kindled his desire to do full-time mission work. He began to see what the Lord meant by "the harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few."

In August 2006, Keithian moved to Nashville, Tennessee to partner with Moses C. Onwubiko, founder of Grace Evangelistic Ministries. While working for Grace Evangelistic Ministries and reading many letters from prisoners all over the world, Keithian sensed the call by God to go back into the prisons, jails and detention centers, taking them the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ and sound Bible teaching. Therefore he incorporated Grace Prison Ministries.

Currently, Keithian teaches weekly at two Nashville jails and one prison. He travels to youth detention centers, jails and prisons in Georgia, Tennessee, Louisiana, and Florida. Keithian shares our Lord's heart for the lost, and a heart for prisoners. He has already walked a mile in their shoes and knows that the only way for them to change is by becoming a new creature in Christ and renewing the mind. The grace and love of God has transformed his life and now he is reaching out and sharing the truth that set him free.
